You're Camp Barnabas Bound!

First and foremost, we are incredibly excited and honored that you have chosen to spend time with us this summer as a Missionary. This is your Barnabas Bound Packet, and in it, you will find packing lists, mail information, our policies, party themes, and a medical form. **Action needed before camp starts:** If you will be 18 or over at the time of camp, please go to ministryopportunities.org/campbarnabas to complete a background check form. This needs to be completed as soon as possible in order to get the check processed before you arrive at camp. The fee for the background check is included in your Missionary fee. We run a new check for everyone 18 and older each year, so even if you have served at camp before, please make sure to fill this out.

Whether you have been serving people with special needs for years or this is your first experience, know that we are going to help prepare you to serve well. You will arrive at camp on Saturday at 4 pm and campers will arrive that Sunday at 4 pm. The time between you arriving and campers arriving will be filled with training to prepare you for the week. Please know that we are praying for you during this time and are excited for what the Lord is going to do in your heart while you are at camp. As you prepare spiritually and mentally for camp, we encourage you to go to www. youtube.com/campbarnabas to see more about the ministry of Barnabas and what you can expect during your week of camp.

You must bring a completed and signed medication form with you to check-in on your arrival day. Everyone MUST check in with our medical team. **Even if you don't take any medication, you must be checked in.** Camp Barnabas must have this signed form for every single participant. DO NOT mail this form in; bring it with you. Please place all medication bottles in a ziplock bag to turn in to the nurses. Remember, ALL medication, herbs, and vitamins must be in the manufacture or prescription bottle. DO NOT pack medication in your luggage. Select missionary medications will be collected at missionary arrival and will be picked back up on Closing Day.

On your arrival day, the gates will open promptly at 4 pm. Check-in is between 4 and 5 pm. It is incredibly important that you arrive during check-in time. In the rare instance that you will be arriving late, please alert us ahead of time by calling the camp office at 417-476-2565. We will begin Missionary training promptly at 5 pm. To ensure that you won't miss any information, please be at camp on time!

On closing day, we will begin Closing Ceremonies in the dining hall at 10:30 am. There will be a missionary closing ceremony immediately following the all-camp one. Please consider being at this to process your week and celebrate one another. ALL MEDICATION GIVEN TO THE MED TEAM ON ARRIVAL DAY MUST BE SIGNED OUT PERSONALLY IN THE WELL HOUSE! No medications will be returned via mail! Everything will be finished, and you will be ready to leave around 11:30. Lunch will not be served on closing day.

If you are flying to Camp Barnabas and need transportation from the Springfield, MO airport, please email your flight itinerary to jamie@campbarnabas.org at least 20 days prior to your arrival at camp. Pick up will be between 3 - 5 pm on opening day and drop off will be 11 am - 12:30 pm on closing day. There will be a \$100.00 round-trip fee. You must be at least 18 years old or have signed consent from a parent.

This technology, offered by Waldo Photos, uses facial and object recognition to match your missionary's face to photos in our album, and then sends them to you via fun and friendly text messages. We'll send you an email before camp with a sign-up link.



We have a Snack Shack for missionaries to be able to go on their hour off. We know you work so hard and we want to give you a place to go and rest. There will be items to purchase, so if you would like to bring a little cash to purchase them, you are welcome to.

- Shorts—Our standard of length for shorts is finger-tip length. Shorts must also be loose-fitting. No "Sofee" style shorts. No shorts or pants with words across the seat are to be worn at any time.
- T-shirts/shirts—No spaghetti straps or tight-fitting shirts. They must completely cover the abdomen. Straps must be at least 2 fingers wide.
- Swimsuits (one piece only or two pieces that completely cover your belly even when your hands are raised in the air.) This will be enforced. Swimming trunks for guys—no Speedos!)
- Closed-toed shoes or shoes with a strap going across the top of the foot and around the heel (i.e., Chacos or Tevas), shower shoes and creek float shoes
- Socks
- Sleepwear
- Underwear
- Stationery & stamps
- Rain jacket or poncho
- Jacket or sweatshirt (believe it or not, it sometimes gets cold at night)
- Jeans/sweatpants
- Toiletries: toothpaste, toothbrush, shampoo, soap, deodorant, hairbrush/comb
- Bedding: Sleeping bag or twin sheets with a blanket and pillow
- Towels and washcloths (at least two of each)
- Costumes for party fun! (See enclosed party list for details)
- Medications and medical equipment/supplies All medications must be in pharmacy labeled bottles. This includes herbs & vitamins. They must be in the original containers.
- Please refer to the medication form. (see enclosed letter from the Director of Health Services)

**Do NOT bring:** expensive jewelry, large sums of money, cell phones, music players, video games, snacks, gum, soda, candy, or cigarettes. If brought to camp, these items will be taken and returned at the end of the week.

#### There is a 3 bag limit due to space being limited.

Mail will be distributed once every day at camp. Any mail we receive after your term will be returned to the sender. Any food or candy sent in a package will be kept in the office until the end of the camp term. When sending emails, put the Missionary's first and last name in the subject line of the email. Due to the cost of ink, greeting cards and pictures sent via email will not be printed and distributed. Email and mail are subject to be read by Camp Barnabas staff. The campers, Missionaries and summer staff of Camp Barnabas are not allowed to make or receive telephone calls while at camp. If there is an emergency, there will be phones available.

## Medical Form

For the safety of and to ensure the continued excellent care of everyone at Camp Barnabas, our medical teams strive to deliver the best medical care possible. Please take a moment to look over our camp medical instructions. If you have questions about your particular needs or medications, please do not hesitate to contact the camp medical director at tracie@campbarnabas.org.

• Prior to arrival at camp, an online medical form must be completed. The online form is not necessary to print and bring. This form is the only one you need to bring to camp.

• All medications MUST BE in pharmacy labeled bottles or packages with camper/missionary's name, medication name, dosage, and instructions for use. Prescribed over-the-counter (OTC) medications must be in the original, manufactured container (bring these to camp with you if you take these daily.)

• Ensure that there is a full 'camp week' quantity of each medication.

• If possible, please bring extra medications to camp as occasionally we need to replace lost or dropped meds. Unused medications can be picked up on Closing Day.

• Medications CANNOT be pre-mixed together or pre-organized into weekly planners, unless prepared by commercial pharmacy. We cannot accept medications brought to camp like this.

• Please DO NOT include any herbs, vitamins, supplements, or oils with your medications. Nurses distribute thousands of pills each week, which takes a tremendous amount of time and organization. Oils frequently are offensive or bother other people in the vicinity, therefore no oils are allowed at camp. We appreciate your flexibility in your medications and schedule!

• THC and any derivative of or synthetic form of medical marijuana, including marinol, regardless of a doctor's prescription or not, must be pre-approved by the chief medical director, Tracie Bishop, MSN. Contact Tracie Bishop with any questions or concerns about your camper/missionary regarding this. If any form of these medication arrive without prior authorization, the medications will be returned to the parent/guardian if still available, or turned over to appropriate authorities for storage.

• All camper medications must be dropped off during camper arrival with the medical team and must be picked up on Closing Day. Select missionary medications will be collected at missionary arrival as well and may also be picked back up on Closing Day. **We cannot mail medications left at Camp back to you.** This is a federal law https://pe.usps.com/text/pub52/pub52c4\_019.htm

Please take a moment to fill out the rest of this form as well as the medication list on the reverse. This form must be filled out for everyone coming to camp, even if they take no medications. Bring this form to opening day, we cannot accept them by mail.

**Statement of Faith:** We believe God almighty to be our creator and heavenly Father, and His Son Jesus Christ to be our Lord and Savior. We also believe the Holy Bible to be His inspired Word and, as such, is our final authority for faith and life. We do not condone the abuse of drugs, alcohol or tobacco, as we believe that it is not in accordance with God's Word. It is our purpose to teach His Word and to glorify Him in all we do.

Barnabas is excited to invite new people into the family of committed Christians who want to further the message of Jesus Christ. We want you to feel a part of our camp family and to realize that we strive to glorify Jesus Christ in everything we do. We especially want the campers to see our staff and Missionaries as living examples of Christ's life. In keeping with that, we have specific policies that we have stated below to allow you to understand what we believe is right and true in the eyes of our Lord.

If you do not agree with these policies, it is important that you let us know. The decisions you make personally about such issues are between you and God. However, we believe those that join the Barnabas family are integrally woven here by the Lord. We ask that, as a part of our family, you join us in upholding the following policies. If you disagree, or feel that, for any reason, you cannot stand on these principles, please contact us by phone or email for discussion.

Please read these policy statements carefully and sign your application only if you agree to abide by them.

Alcohol, Illegal Drugs & Tobacco: Our staff does not condone or personally use illegal drugs or tobacco. We do not condone the abuse of alcohol or allow for drunkenness.

**Sexual Behavior:** Although we love all of God's people and we know sin takes many forms, we do not condone premarital sex and homosexual relationships in accordance with God's laws.

**Appearance & Dress Code:** God does not judge man by appearances; He looks at the heart. But, we still feel convicted to present a clean-cut appearance on the outside, as well as the inside. Men must shave daily. You may keep your facial hair if you come to camp with a beard or mustache that is well-groomed. Everyone should keep a neat appearance. Hair length is optional; however, men with long hair must keep it in a ponytail, for safety as well as appearance. All hair must be well-groomed at all times.

**Shirts:** T-shirts should reflect a Christian image and not have inscriptions or advertising for questionable products (i.e., beer products or slanderous sayings). No spaghetti-strap, tight-fitting or low-cut shirts. Straps on shirts must be at least the width of two fingers and completely cover bra straps. Shirts must cover abdomen, even when hands are lifted in the air.

**Shorts/Pants:** For our campers, our standard of length for shorts is finger-tip length. Shorts must also be loose-fitting. No "Sofee" style shorts. No shorts or pants with words across the seat are to be worn at any time.

**Shoes:** Shoes must be worn at all times unless at the pool. Close-toed shoes or shoes with a strap going across the top of the foot and around the heel (i.e., Chacos or Tevas) are required during all activities, with the exception of to and from the pool.

**Swimsuits:** Men must wear swim trunks (no Speedos). Women must wear modest one-piece swimsuits. Two-piece swimsuits will be permitted provided they completely cover the abdomen area even with hands in the air. No low-cut swimsuits are to be worn. If necessary, girls may wear shirts over their swimsuits as long as the shirts are not white.

**Tattoos & Body Piercings:** While at camp, it is suggested that all piercings be removed for safety reasons. Some campers love shiny objects. If you do not choose to remove your piercings, please only use studs. Our Missionaries will wear no naval, eyebrow or tongue jewelry at camp (this is a safety issue). At the discretion of the camp directors, any tattoo that may be viewed as inappropriate will need to be covered at all times. You are an example of a Christian lifestyle to your campers. Parents count on you to represent a clean-cut example. If discussions occur about tattoos or body piercing with the campers or other participants, please try to steer the conversation in another direction and do not encourage campers or other participants to get tattoos or body piercings.

**Cell Phones & Laptop Computers:** In the world of high technology, we have to make a policy for electronic use. To avoid distraction and to allow you to get the full Barnabas experience, laptop computers are not to be brought to camp for use. No emails are to be sent or received on any computer while you are serving at camp. We do not allow the use of cell phones at camp for any reason. If you need to make an emergency call, there are phones available. (Exceptions are made to this policy for group leaders and Adult Leaders - 30 and over.)

These are our guidelines. Thank you for choosing to follow them. I know we're going to have a great summer. If you have any questions or comments about these policies, please ask us.
