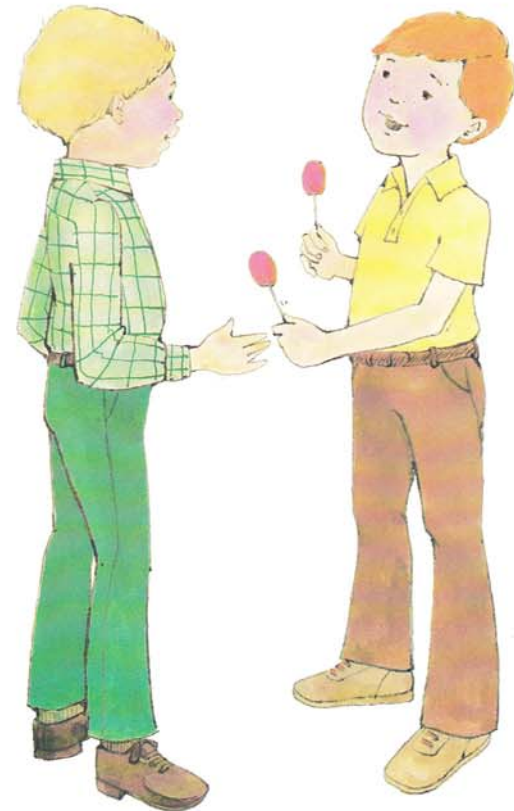


Meekness
